- The Sustainability budget was passed with a vote of 22 yes votes and 9 no votes. We have attached the new county council budget to the end of the newsletter.
- Sunrise Breakfast fee will be \$5 for run of fair or \$1 a day. Fee can be paid in advance or at Sunrise breakfast. More details to come closer to fair.
- 2017-18 4-H Calendar was reviewed and a few changes made. Proposed 4-H Calendar attached to the newsletter.
- The council approve to pay for the re-finger printing for leaders from 2007 and prior up to \$30. The leaders that are affected will receive a letter from the 4-H office.

3. County Record Books Judging:

We are willing to move forward with a county record book evaluation competition with the following guidelines in place.

- We will need from clubs 2 volunteers for every 3 books sent to county Evaluation. Those volunteers will need to stay until all books are evaluated with the exception being, your own club's books are all that is left to evaluate.
- If a club cannot supply the number of adult volunteers required, the club will be disqualified from competition. Those books will only be reviewed for comments at a later date.
- Record books will need to turn in from clubs with required County record book summary sheet completed by club leaders to the county office by Aug.10th at 5pm. Late turn ins will be reviewed for comments only.

County Evaluation night will tentatively be August 17th at 6pm until finished.

- 2017-2018 4-H Adult Volunteer Re-Appointment Process
- 1. Begin the 4-H adult volunteer re-application process in 4hOnline:

Login to family profile at https://ca.4honline.com. Login to adult record and click "Enroll for 2017-2018". Enter all required information and submit. 4hOnline adult status will show as pending.

- 2. Complete the required "2017-2018 Returning Volunteers Training" in eXtension* (go to https://campus.extension.org/enrol/index.php?id=1410).
 - a. Toward an Interculturally Connected 4-H (60 min)
 - b. Abuse Risk Management for Volunteers (15 min)

Santa Cruz County Fair 2017 Livestock Entry Guide New for this year:

Required Exhibitor Training for All livestock exhibitors at the Monterey County and Santa Cruz County Fairs are required to attend an educational training session this year.

The sessions will include

- Ethics Training
- Red Tag/Disqualification Policies
- Manure Management and Storm Water Runoff
- Animal Treatment, Rights Activists, Responses, etc.
- Food safety (e coli, other pathogens) for exhibitors and patrons
- Production of food for human consumption (feed additives, medications, steroids and other biologics)

Each fair will offer a training session – exhibitors may attend the session most convenient for them.

- Monterey County Fair July 29, 2017, 9 a.m. to noon, Monterey Fairgrounds Salinas Room
- Santa Cruz County Fair August 12, 2017, 9 a.m. to noon, Santa Cruz Fairgrounds Heritage Hall Santa Cruz County fair exhibitors may attend either session.




