Fallbrook, CA (San Diego County)

Sunday, December 17, 2017 - 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

A 4-H shooting sports workshop for the rifle discipline will be held at Defensive Tactics and Firearms, 504 E. Alvarado Street # 207, Fallbrook, CA. Participants must attend both days of training to receive certification. Upon successful completion of the course, the participant will be certified as a rifle trainer and can lead a rifle project at the club level or serve as county trainer to certify other leaders. The cost for the course is \$25 and includes all training material and range fees. The nearest food source is 10 minutes away so it is recommended you bring your own lunch.
