**4-H Program Rep**: Juli spoke on the event replacing LCORT and encouraged members to attend. She also reminded of several upcoming deadlines for events and/or participation.

Sustainability (Rachel Taylor) reviewed the materials she has been working with Northern Trust to lessen Council's annual fees while making additional income. The entire process was detailed, an on a motion by Sandra Green/Danielle Nino the recommendation the Council voted to accept the proposal from Northern Trust.

**New Business:** Fire relief (proposal by Union Club); since many clubs in the North State had lost items needed for project and club meetings, the SBC 4-H Council and all the membership is encouraged to share duplicated items to benefit those who are in need.

**Breakfast with Santa**: Leaders, Members, and Officers of the Union Club provided an overview of this community event and asked for an activity grant in the amount of \$1,000.00 for supplies. That request was granted on a motion by Susan Stricker/Delores Lashley. Community Club leader Sandra Green encouraged all present to bring their clubs to the event for quality (and fun) participation.

Program Rep Juli encouraged good involvement in the <u>event which replaces LCORT</u>. The Travel committee will plan and announce best ways to gain entrance to the event.

Program Rep Juli gave an overview of **"Giving Tuesday"** wherein members are encouraged to support 4-H by giving donations which may be matched.

County Director and 4-H Advisor Lynn told of the need for more storage space for 4-H related materials. Following discussion, a suggestion was made that could be an excellent Emerald Star

project. That concept will be investigated.


The list of 217 - 18 Council Committee Chairs and Members was perused. This will be further discussed at a future meeting.



### San Benito County 4-H "Bank on Us" Award

### Qualifications and Process

The primary purpose of the San Benito County 4-H "Bank on Us" Award program is to help 4-H members learn the life skills of self-discipline, goal setting, decision-making, planning, organizing, and leadership.

The more time and energy that you devote to 4-H and school, the more "interest" you will receive when you gradulate from high school. At the time of graduation, if you have met all the requirements, you will neceive a cash award from San Benito County 4-H Council. Awards are based upon the highest ranking achieved and are not cumulative.

Member must have completed three consecutive years in the San Benito County 4-Horogram during the last three years of the member's high school career and must be in good standing and, if part of the traditional club mode, have completed all travel obligations and commitments. Members enrolling by December 31% of the year they turn 15 are eligible. (If you graduate early, you must have completed three consecutive years in the San Benito County 4-H program (enrolled by December 31% of the first year) at the time you graduate to quality).

A completed application must be attached to a resume OR a written journal OR Personal Development Reports showing at least the last 3 years' activities (updated through April 1 of the current year) as documentation of involvement. All supporting documentation must be signed by the applicant, parent, and 4-Hicader/supervisor. An updated transcript is required for the GPA bonus of all awards.

Members selected to be a 4-H State Ambassador or on the 4-H Technology Team: additional \$1,000.00

All Stars/County Ambassadors who completed their All Star year with 80% participation and attendance in events/activities (based on the contract they signed up under): additional \$1,000.00

\*\*NOTE: Any ongoing commitments or awards whose re-verified before awards are dispersed in June.

Definitions for the Categories of Participation chart:

- A project counts when a member has completed a minimum of six hours of project instruction or more as required by the project leader. Terms or semesters are determined by the leadership of the non-club mode.
- 2) Events or activities that demonstrate your knowledge to an audience or judge. Activities include Exhibits (both Judged/Evaluated and Non Judged/Evaluated) showmanship, Knowledge Contests, and Judging Contests.
- 3) Any 4-H events attended outside of traditional-mode regular club and project meetings (e.g. Achievement Night, County Holiday Dessett, Fastion Revue, etc.).
- 4) Each leadership position and at the club, county, sectional, state, national and/or non-club 4-H mode levels.
- 5) Active participation in a planned, publicized and approved citizenship, service learning or community service activity.
- 6) Compunication activities participated in at any event inside or outside 4-H (i.e. 4-H Formal Presentations as defined by the Presentation Manual (including a Demonstration, Illustrated Talk, Science or Engineering Presentation, by the Presentation Manual (including a Demonstration, Illustrated Talk, Science or Engineering Presentation, by the Reading Presentation, Prepared Speech, Impromptu Speech, and Could a Presentation of Prepared Talks, Radio and Television and Presentation, Prepared Talks, Radio and Television Apply Jances, Newspaper Articles written and submitted by the member, Letters, Judge or Evaluator for a 4-H activity or contest, Representing 4-H to outside groups or community audiences, Online Communication created or moderated by the member, ORB Spark Score Surveys).



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### Guidelines for San Benito County 4-H Memorial Scholarships

Three 4-H Scholarship programs are available to San Benito County 4-H members who:

- Are currently enrolled and active in San Benito County 4-H.
- Are graduating from high school.
- Completed 4 consecutive years in the San Benito County 4-H program, including the year they're
  applying.

### 1. GEORGIA WAPPLE FRAZER

- One 4-year scholarship (\$1000/year \$4000 total)
- Recipient of four-year scholarship will have four years to access funds.

### Additional Eligibility Requirements:

- A scholastic record of 3.0 or higher for the last three years of high school.
- The rank of Gold Star or Level 3 (on Categories of Participation chart) or higher in the 4-H Incentives and Awards Program.

### 2. JOHN W. RICOTTI 4-H MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to 2 scholarships at the Incentive & Recognition Committee and judges' discretion \$500 -\$1,000 maximum.
- Recipient has one year to access funds.
- No additional eligibility requirements.

### 3. 4-H MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to 2 scholarships at the Incentive & Recognition Committee and Judges' discretion \$500 -\$1,000 maximum.
- Recipient has one year to access funds.
- No additional eligibility requirements.

### Applicant must:

- 1. Submit a completed Application (Form A), two recommendations (Forms B & C), and an official sealed high school transcript as well as a 4-H Record book with at least 4 years' records (PDR, signatures, & at least one page "4-H Story" updated to at least March 1) OR resume OR written journal reflecting at least the last 4 years' information through at least March 1 of the current year and signed by applicant, parent, and 4-H leader/supervisor.
- 2. Be interviewed by a panel of community members. You will be contacted for an interview no later than the second week in May.

Selection Criteria: Awards can be withheld if applicants do not meet criteria.

Scholarships may be used at any school of continuing education above high school.

After being awarded a scholarship, the recipient must submit to the San Benito 4-H Office a transcript from a postsecondary institution that shows completion of at least 12 semester/quarter units and proof of re-enrollment as a full-time student. (Recipients of John W. Ricotti and 4-H Memorial Scholarships need only do this once, but the GWF recipient must provide this documentation throughout the 4 years.) If student ends up deferring schooling for a year, s/he must come to Council to ask for payment to be deferred for up to a year.

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES**

### **Procedures**

- 1. The 4-H Youth Development Center Farm (4-H YDC&F) is located at 1479 Nash Road, Hollister.
- 2. Under ownership of the University of California, the 4-H YDC&F is locally managed and operated by the University of California Cooperative Extension 4-H Youth Development Program in San Benito County.
- 3. The 4-H YDC&F are guided and managed at all times by The University of California and 4-H Youth Development Program policies and practices at the state and local level including, but not limited to:
  - a. The State 4-H Program 4-H Code of Conduct
  - b. The San Benito County 4-H Participation Guidelines
- 4. The 4-H YDC&F is open and available to all San Benito County 4-H Members meeting eligibility and enrollment requirements.
- 5. The 4-H YDC&F is a multi-use facility and can with the permission of the 4-H YDC&F committee be used for all approved 4-H projects to enhance learning experiences in the following project areas: Civic Engagement, Communications and Expressive Arts, Leadership and Personal Development, Health, Personal Safety, Animal Science, Consumer and Family Science, Environmental and Earth Science, Physical Science, Technology and Engineering.
- 6. All activities must be approved by the project leader, the 4-H YDC&F Committee and 4-H Program Staff.
- 7. No smoking of tobacco products, no tobacco chew, no marijuana products, no alcohol, drugs or weapons are allowed at the 4-H YDC&F at any time.
- 8. 4-H Member(s) shall not be left unsupervised at the 4-H YDC&F. Per California State 4-H policy, two adults (minimum one 4-H volunteer and one adult 25 years of age or older) must be present if there are youth (other than parent and child) present at the facility.
- 9. The 4-H YDC&F is open 6 a.m. 9 p.m., except under special circumstances with prior approval from the 4-H YDC&F Committee.
- 10. County 4-H Program staff and 4-H YDC&F committee members have permission and authority to enter and inspect the projects for the following reasons:
  - a. In case of an emergency.
  - b. To make necessary or agreed upon repairs, alterations, or improvements.
  - c. When there are, concerns regarding abandoned project animals, stalls or pens.
  - d. Concerns have been raised about 4-H project/animal(s) housed at the 4-H YDC&F
  - e. To inspect the condition of the animal and the stall/pen.

11. The 4-H Member shall not violate any 4-H YDC&F rules concerning the use of the premises, commit feed waste, be a nuisance, annoy, or interfere with any other 4-H members, projects, or neighbors.

### **Facility**

- 1. The 4-H YDC&F premises are to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.
- 2. It is expected that members will properly use and operate all electrical and plumbing fixtures, and keep all fixtures clean and sanitary.
- 3. All trash is to be taken home (including feed sacks) immediately, and is not to be left to accumulate. No trash is to be discarded at the 4-H YDC&F.
- 4. No alterations, improvements, or decorations can be done by the 4-H Member without prior written consent from the 4-H YDC&F Committee. Any improvements to the premises shall become the property of the 4-H YDC&F at the end of occupancy. The 4-H YDC&F Committee may require that all improvements be removed at the end of occupancy.

### Workdays/Chores

- 1. Attendance at 4-H YDC&F workdays is mandatory. Each member is expected to contribute six hours per use Agreement.
- 2. Any incomplete hours from previous year and the six hours for the new year will need to be completed if you would like to return to the 4-H YDC&F prior to the arrival of a new animal for current year.
- 3. Your attendance at the workdays will be taken into consideration when the 4-H YDC&F Use Agreements are reviewed for space allocation in the future.
- 4. Duties and responsibilities must be carried out when assigned. Failure to complete tasks will be grounds for dismissal from the 4-H YDC&F.
- 5. If you do not contribute the mandatory six hours of service at the 4-H YDC&F and would like to use the facility in the next program year, you must make-up the remaining hours from the previous year BEFORE your current application is accepted. You will also need to complete the mandatory six hours of service for the current year before you will be able to bring your animal to the 4-H YDC&F.

### **Equipment**

- 1. All personal property must be clearly marked.
- 2. Only general use equipment and materials (leads, brooms, rakes, water and feed pans, buckets, etc.) will be allowed to be housed at the 4-H YDC&F. No trailers or refrigerated medications are allowed to be stored for longer than two days pre-or post event at the 4-H YDC&F.
- 3. Personal property must be removed at the end date of this Agreement.

### ANIMAL SCIENCE PROJECT GUIDELINES

### Animals

- 1. *Market Animals*: Are short term (usually less than one year) projects. The goal is for animals to be purchased, raised, shown, and then sold through auction at fairs.
- 2. Breeding Animals: Are long term (multi-year) projects. It is the next step in project education that increases a member's responsibility, involvement, and education by raising animals from start to finish. The purpose in breeding is to produce additional market animals that can be raised, shown, and sold at auction at fairs or to increase your breeding stock. Market animals will be considered first for space availability. Each breeding project will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the 4-H YDC&F Committee.
  - a. *Breeding Guidelines*: Members must submit a written breeding plan to this contract for consideration of your breeding project by the 4-H YDC&F Committee.
- 3. Weed Abatement Animals: Due to the terrain of the 4-H YDC&F, a regular and consistent mowing weed abatement program is not feasible. Members in the San Benito County 4-H Youth Development Program that would like to graze sheep and/or goats at the 4-H YDC&F for the purpose of weed abatement should contact the 4-H YDC&F committee. These animals will only be permitted on the 4-H YDC&F as needed and will leave the facility when they are not needed.
- 4. All animal projects must be approved by the project leader, the 4-H YDC&F Committee and 4-H Program Staff.
- 5. Only 6 livestock animals (combination of market and breeding) per member at a time will be allowed in the upper stalls at any given time.
- 6. There are 10 Sheep, 4 Goat pens and 20 Swine pens. The maximum allowed per pen is 2 Sheep, Goats or Swine, unless the pen is shared by a family, upon which the may be 3 animals of the same species.
- 7. There are 6 Beef pens. The maximum allowed per pen is 1 Beef. Additional Beef space may be accommodated upon request of the 4-H YDC&F committee.
- 8. 4-H YDC&F Committee must be notified before:
  - a. Project/Animal(s) brought to the 4-H YDC&F.
  - b. Projects/Animal(s) removed from the 4-H YDC&F for exercise or any other purpose.
  - c. Projects/Animal(s) moved from one stall to another, except in an emergency.

### Stalls/Pens

- 1. 4-H member will be charged \$10.00 fee per animal to use the 4-H YDC&F. The payment is submitted with your completed farm agreement to the 4-H farm chairman prior to the arrival of your animal (s) on the 4-H YDC&F.
- 2. Animal projects will be housed in assigned stall(s). SBCF market animals will be given priority.

- 3. The 4-H Member is responsible for stalls being cleaned daily. Animals should not be left in dirty pens. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to ensure that his/her animal is healthy and happy.
- 4. Parents/Guardians may help with cleaning up, but the care of the animal is the 4-H Member's responsibility.
- 5. All manure and feed is to be disposed of at designated areas.
- 6. Stalls/pens and gates are to be secured with quick release latches. No locks are allowed unless approved by the farm committee.
- 7. Animals must be removed from the premises after the end date of this Agreement. After a project, has been removed from the 4-H YDC&F, stalls/pens must be cleaned and disinfected within two weeks. A 4-H member who has not cleaned their area will be assessed a cleaning fee of \$50.00 per pen and will not be allowed to use the 4-H YDC&F in the future.

### **Time Line**

- 1. Dates of Agreement may not exceed 12 months, and must be renewed annually.
- 2. The 4-H YDC&F will not be the permanent home for any market animal. Animals may be housed at the 4-H YDC&F January 1 through December 31 annually.
- 3. Space is limited at the 4-H YDC&F. Use Agreements will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis, and are due with all signatures by May 1<sup>st</sup> annually.

### **Feedings**

- 1. Animals must be the responsibility of the 4-H Member and must be under their care and ownership to meet the requirements of project completion and to show and exhibit at fairs and expositions where San Benito County 4-H members are eligible.
- 2. Animals must be fed, watered and cared for at all times.
- 3. No garbage or food scraps are to be fed to project animals at any time.
- 4. Parents/Guardians are discouraged from feeding and caring for the project/animal, unless the 4-H member is sick or otherwise unable to do so. Please contact the 4-H YDC&F Committee when the 4-H Member is unable to feed and/or care for the project/animal. On-going or chronic violations of this rule may result in a member being ineligible to house their animal at the 4-H YDC&F in the future.

### Medication

1. The 4-H Member is responsible for the purchase of all medications and equipment needed, including his/her own thermometer.

- 2. The 4-H Member shall not diagnose any illness or prescribe any medication. The 4-H Member should notify his/her project leader and/or veterinarian immediately. Project leaders should not dispense medication without member consent.
- 3. The 4-H Member is responsible for the removal of an animal in the event of death.
- 4. The 4-H YDC&F Committee has the right to remove or quarantine any and all sick animals. The 4-H Member will be notified and asked to call a veterinarian.

### **Infractions and Agreements**

- 1. If animals or projects are not being cared for properly the member will be given a written warning by your project leader, from the 4-H YDC&F chair or 4-H Youth Development Staff. If concerns continue, members will be given notice to remove the animal/project from the premises.
- 2. The 4-H program staff and 4-H YDC&F Committee will make decisions regarding violations of this Agreement. Violations of this Agreement can result in a loss of 4-H YDC&F privileges.
- 3. The 4-H Member and Parent/Guardian agree to the contents of this Agreement and the San Benito County 4-H YDC&F Rules. By signing this form, you are indicating that you have read and understand the rules and expectations for use of the facilities at the 4-H YDC&F located at 1479 Nash Road.

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
