San Benito County 4H Program Funding 2019-2020

The Challenge: San Benito County 4-H's Program Representative position is funded through UCCE Cooperative Extension (which we tend to just refer to as UC Davis). UCCE is funded by a combination of Federal Government, State of California, and County Government subsidies. Over the last few years, UCCE has not received enough funds from the Federal/State/County Governments to keep up with expenses. That has reached a crunch point where UCCE must ask the programs dependent on them to be more financially independent. Because UCCE won't know how much money they are getting from the Federal/State/County governments for a while, they don't yet know how much additional funding they must ask of us. However, our budget needs to be in place by July 1st along with any changes we make to the annual fees our members pay.

This will be an ongoing challenge with the goal from UCCE of getting 4-H Counties financially independent over the next five years. Because there are so many unknowns, our county will be looking at solutions one year at a time.

Funds Estimated for 2019-2020 Year:

This coming year, we will need to cover 6.2% for increases in our Program Representative's salary and benefits. However, if Federal/State/County contributions remain flat or decrease we may be asked to cover an additional .15% of our Program Rep's total salary and benefits. These percentages translate between to \$2019 - \$12,462 for next year.

Sources of Funding: We are not being asked to solve this problem alone. UCCE wants to be part of the solution.

Fundraising: Lynn and Julie are being trained by UCCE in community fundraising campaigns. SBC 4-H will be putting together a fundraising committee to help them. They are in need of three to four 4-H adults and three to four community members (outside of 4-H) who have experience, passion and/or ideas for large-scale fundraising. The hope is that by fundraising we can raise \$4-\$8000 next year, but this is not guaranteed.

Increase Annual Fees: Fees for 2019-2020 currently stand at \$58 Youth & \$24 Adult Volunteer. We have 418 youth and 135 adults in our county. If we add in the additional needed funds to our youth fees, we get the following:

George Wapple Frazier Endowment: San Benito County 4-H has its own Endowment Fund that pays for our local activities, conferences for youth, and scholarships. UCCE is not asking us to use these funds for program fees. The longstanding preference has always been to safeguard the GWF for direct support of youth activities. We are also limited to spending only \$80K of the GWF funds annually. However, as a county, we can still choose to draw on GWF funds for Program Fees if our budget allows.

ToDo: Please take this information back to your club. Have a discussion on how much individuals and families are comfortable paying in annual dues. Bring this information back to our May County Meeting.

Schedule: May 27th Council Meeting: Discussion on Funding leading to a motion for 2019-2020 Fee Rates. We will also have a motion for our 2019-2020 budget.

June 24th Council Meeting: County Wide balloted vote on Fee Increase & Budget.
