<u>4-H Enrollment Updates:</u>

- We are excited to announce the new credit card option for payment of enrollment fees. Your family has the option of paying the 4-H club leader directly with a cash/check payment to receive a discount. You also have the option to pay online with a credit card directly to the UCANR for your 4-H enrollment fees this year.
 - Credit Card link:
 - The 4-H enrollments fees have changed for 2019-20. We how have three tiers which offer discounts. Register today to save money!!
 - 2019-2020 Returning Youth Member Enrollment Fee with cash/check discount schedule:
 - Early Bird Special: July 1st August 31st = \$70
 - Regular: September 1st November 30th = \$80
 - Late Enrollment: December 1st to June 30th = \$90
 - 2019- 2020 Returning Adult Leader Enrollment Fee with cash/check discount schedule:

- Early Bird Special: July 1st August 31st = \$24
- Regular: September 1st November 30th = \$24
- Late Enrollment: December 1st to June 30th = \$24
- 2019-2020 New youth member & new leader enrollment fee with cash/check discount schedule. The enrollment fee will remain at early bird special only if the fee is paid within 30 days of registering on-line for 4-H! If you choose to pay the registration fee after 30 day of registration the fee will be the same as returning members and/or leader from date scale fee chart above.

Just a reminder to all youth, parents and leaders. A 4-H member needs to be in good standing to be eligible to show livestock at the county fairs and state fair! A member in good standing is current 4-H enrollment, 4-H registration paid, minimum of 6 hours completed in project plus 80% of the additional meeting required by project leader, members APR (Annual Project Report) completed

Fair entry dates:

- ✤ Check with all fairs to verify the entry dates for livestock and non-livestock.
- All three local fairs require a <u>youth department entry</u> for all livestock exhibitors. Remember to enter in both livestock and non-livestock enters. As well as YQCA Training completed by entry dates for fairs.

* Monterey fair due dates

 - Open 4-H & FFA (nonperishable entries) DUE Saturday, August 17th
 - Baked goods & cut flowers, Horticulture is due, Saturday, August 24th

* Santa Cruz Fair due dates:

- ***POULTRY SPECIAL NOTICE:** Because of California State Poultry Health Regulations, all birds entered in the Fair must first pass through a certified poultry health inspection before being placed in their show cages. A special inspection site will be placed on the fairgrounds and birds must pass through this station before entering poultry building. Coop-in times have been extended in order to ease the inspection process. A notice will be sent to each exhibitor entered in show, giving location of inspection station. Thank you for your patience.
- Youth department online entries are due AUGUST 17th by midnight

 - You must enter an exhibit in youth department if you are showing livestock.

- You may also enter in person on paper entry until August 31st in person in youth department at the fair.
- Livestock online entries & wristbands are due by August 24th
- Check entry book for any additional requirements
- The fair will be holding a mandatory meeting on weigh-in day for livestock exhibitors. We are waiting on more details of time for the meeting.

* San Benito Fair due dates:

- All entries are online Entries close September 5th at midnight.
- Check entry book for any additional requirements
- You must in enter in 4-H youth department to be eligible to show livestock in the fair.
- Check entry book for any additional requirements.

YQCA Livestock Training Update

We have been informed that all livestock exhibitor showing at county and state fairs throughout California will be required to complete an ethics training.

- The YQCA online course fee is \$12.
- You can take the YQCA course with a certified instructor for \$3 but will need to register online prior to the course.
- You will be issued a certificate after completing the course.
- * The certificate is valid for one year from the original date you completed the YQCA course.
- ✤ All the fairs are excepting the YQCA online training. Here is the link: <u>http://yqca.org/</u>.
- All livestock exhibitors make sure to check the requirements for the fair you are attending prior to completing your fair entries.
- ✤ The 4-H office will not be providing in person training for YQCA.

Returning Adult Leaders:

Course Overview:

The Returning Volunteer Training is designed to give volunteers returning for the 2019-20 program year. The information to prepare them for service in 4-H. This training has 2 components that are designed to be completed in sequential order. The course does not need to be completed in one sitting and will pick up where you left off when you return to The overall training will take approximately 30 minutes to complete.

Who Should Attend: Adult Volunteers Returning for the 2019-20 Program Year? **Technical Note:** This training works best using the Mozilla Firefox Browser.

New Adult Leaders:

Course Overview:

The New Volunteer Training is designed to give new volunteers basic information to prepare them for service in 4-H. This training has 10 components that are designed to be completed in sequential order. As you complete each section, lessons in the next section will appear.

The course does not need to be completed in one sitting and will pick up where you left off when you return to it except for the Orientation Video which is an actual video.

The overall training will take approximately 3 hours to complete.

Who Should Attend: New Adult Volunteers

New Adult Leaders will have to complete the following steps:

- Complete the interest adult leader survey
- ✤ Interview with the 4-H office
- ✤ Re-register your 4-H enrollment in 4-H online
- ✤ Re-process the live scan
- Complete the adult leader online training
