

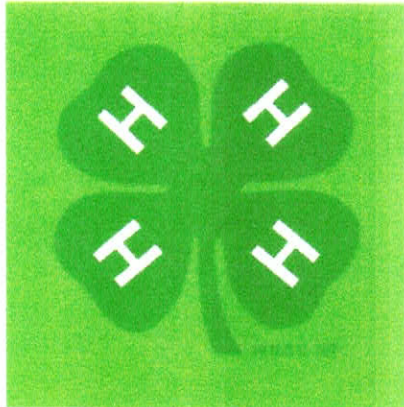




4-H BOOTH AT THE MIGRANT HEALTH FAIR
